

REVOLUTIONARY READINGS

Written by West Virginia's first State Historian and State Archivist, Virgil Lewis's History of the Battle of Point Pleasant offers a detailed account of the historic Battle of Point Pleasant. A native of Mason County, Lewis grew up hearing stories of the battle from descendants the who men participated in it, which sparked an immediate interest in the future State Historian. Arbuckle's Fort Preserve. a 25-acre historical area in Greenbrier County, is now open to the public. Constructed in the mid-1770s, Arbuckle's Fort was part of a system of forts constructed to protect settlers along the western frontier. The fort was first occupied by Captain Matthew Arbuckle and his militia company, who resided there until the fall of 1774 when they left to join Colonel Andrew Lewis in the Battle of Point Pleasant. Other militia companies occupied the fort throughout the Revolutionary War, and the fort was attacked at least twice.

Archaeological excavations have been conducted at Arbuckle's Fort since 1990. Archaeologists and Greenbrier County natives, Kim and Stephen McBride. led several excavations revealing features such as a stone chimney base and a trench. Artifacts have also been recovered at the site. including a Liberty letter seal and wrought iron tools. Efforts to establish the preserve began in 2020. The creation of this preserve was a collaborative effort between the Archaeological Conservancy, the West Virginia Land Trust, Greenbrier County Commission, and the Greenbrier Historical Society. The site includes an archaeological research preserve with public interpretation and a new hiking trail.



OLD TIME COUNTRY COOKIN'

Beef Stew

Ingredients:

- 2 pounds shoulder trimmings 1 white turnip 2 quarts boiling water 2 potatoes sliced 1 onion
- 1 c. tomatoes 1 carrot 2 ½ teaspoons salt ¼ teaspoon pepper ¼ c. flour



Preparation:

Cut beef into pieces for serving, add water and simmer two hours; finely chop onion, carrot, and turnip and add to meat; add potatoes, tomatoes, and seasonings, and cook forty-five minutes; thicken with flour mixed to paste with cold water; serve with dumplings.
