On November 8, 2024, West Virginia Archives & History hosted a "Celebration of West Virginia Veterans," an event to honor the history and importance of our state's many veterans. The event featured two different panel sessions, one in the morning and one in the afternoon, which included guest speakers Kristen Bailey, James Brockman, Angela Baldree, Steve Halstead, Kyle Warmack, Monica Lewis, Dr. Corrina M. Boggess, Dr. Charles Ledbetter, and Ron Wroblewski.

The morning session was opened by the George Washington High School JROTC, which presented colors before the morning panel began. The panelists then gave brief presentations on a variety of topics relating to World War I, World War II, and the Korean War. Morning panelists included Kristen Bailey, James Brockman, Angela Baldree, and Steve Halstead.


## REVOLUTIONARY READINGS

Are you interested in learning more about the governance of Virginia before West Virginia became a separate state? Then you should check out <u>Official Letters of the Governors of Virginia!</u>



# **Ginger Wafers**


<u>Ingredients</u> - 1/2 cup shortening; 1/2 tablespoon baking soda; 1 cup brown sugar; 1/4 teaspoon salt; 2 1/4 cups bread flour; 1 1/4 teaspoon ginger; 1/2 cup milk

<u>Preparation</u> - Cream shortening and sugar; sift baking soda, salt, and ginger with flour, and add alternately with milk; chill; roll thin on baking sheet; mark in squares, and bake in a moderate oven eight or ten minutes. Remove from pan while warm.
